

# Flowers

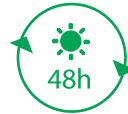


## Description

Flowers are divided into 3 categories: perennials, annuals and biennials.

Perennials are flowers that re-flower year after year, unlike annuals, which flower and fruit in the same year. Biennials take 2 years to complete their flowering cycle.

## Watering



Water regularly until the seeds set, to keep the soil moist at all times.

## Sowing flowerbed

To create a flower bed, broadcast seeds. Distribute seeds randomly, avoiding accumulations. Bury the seeds with the back of a rake. Press down and water in fine rain.

## Maintenance

Remove wilted flowers, so that new ones can appear later.

Shake off wilted flowers, the seeds from which will spread and enable new flowers to appear next year.

## Sowing border

For decorative curves or lines: sow in rows. Dig furrows, spacing seeds at least 5 cm apart. Cover with soil, press down and water with in fine rain.

Sow in a small hole about 5 cm deep. Place 3-4 seeds well apart. Cover with potting soil. Water in fine rain.

## Tips

Certain flowers such as marigolds, nasturtiums, etc. are generally sown to limit the appearance of certain pests in the vegetable garden, mainly aphids.
