

Strawberry



Description

Belonging to the Rosaceae family, strawberries are appreciated for both their appearance and their distinctive sweet taste.

Strawberries are rich in water and fiber, as well as antioxidants and vitamins.

Watering



Water regularly to keep the soil moist.

Sowing

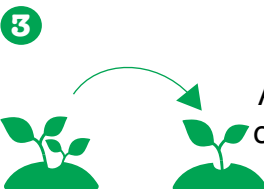


Sow in pots. Place a few seeds, spacing them well apart. Cover with potting soil. Water in fine rain.



As soon as the plants have 5-6 leaves, transplant them into the ground. Water in fine rain.

Maintenance



After transplanting, keep only the most vigorous plants, spacing them 30 cm apart.

Weeding and hoe regularly to limit weeds.

Netting can be installed to protect strawberries from external pests.

Harvest



Between 6 and 10 months after sowing, strawberries can be harvested, depending on the variety.

Tips

A number of plants can be combined with strawberries to protect them from pests and ensure their growth: with aromatics such as basil and thyme, as well as tomatoes, leeks, beans and lettuces.
