

Roselle



Description

Roselle produces a flower called hibiscus. The flower can be eaten or sown for decorative purposes.

Its calyxes vary in color, usually green or red. The calyxes are used to make syrups, jellies, fruit juices, jams and sorbets.

Watering



Regular watering is necessary for good seedling development.



Sowing

1



Sow in a small hole about 5 cm deep. Place 4-5 seeds, spacing them well apart. Cover with potting soil. Water in fine rain.

2



As soon as 4-5 leaves appear, keep only the most vigorous plants.

Harvest



About 3 months after sowing, harvest calyxes as needed

Maintenance

No maintenance is required during the entire roselle cultivation period.

Roselle is quite resistant to disease and pests. What's more, it can bring many benefits to neighboring plants.
