Papayas love tropical climates, so they'll be just right in your garden!

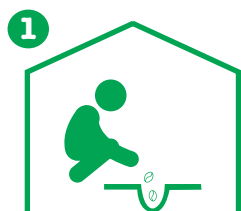
Watering



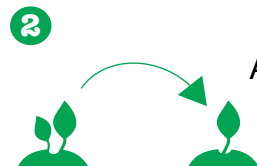
Regular watering is required throughout the growing period.



Sowing



1 Sow in a nursery, in a small hole about 30cm deep. Place 3-4 seeds well apart. Cover with potting soil. Water in fine rain.



2 As soon as 4-5 leaves appear, keep only the most vigorous seedlings in each pot and replant in the desired location.

Harvest



About 8 to 10 months after planting, harvest papayas as needed.

Maintenance

Remove dried leaves to preserve the plant.

Overall, papaya seedlings require very little maintenance.
